# **Senate Bill 433**

1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,

designated §61-2-31, relating to recognizing a fetus as a separate victim.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

#### ARTICLE 2. CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON.

#### §61-2-31. Recognizing a fetus as a distinct victim.

- 1 (a) Any person convicted of any misdemeanor or felony in violation of this code where a
- 2 pregnant woman is involved, the fetus she is carrying in the womb constitutes a separate and
- 3 <u>distinct victim.</u>
- 4 (b) For the purposes of this section "fetus" means a developing human that has ended the
- 5 embryonic period and thereafter continues to develop and mature until termination of the
- 6 pregnancy or birth.
- 7 (c) A prosecution for or conviction under this section is not a bar to conviction of or
- 8 punishment for any other crime committed by the defendant arising from the same incident.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to recognize a fetus as a separate victim.
