A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §18-2E-8g, relating to agricultural education in high schools; requiring that a
West Virginia Department of Education approved agricultural education program be
offered in every West Virginia high school.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

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ARTICLE 2E. HIGH QUALITY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

§18-2E-8g. Creating successful careers through agricultural education.

(a) Findings and intent. -- The Legislature finds that through agricultural education students are provided opportunities for leadership development, personal growth and career success in the science, business, and technology of agriculture. Quality agricultural education instruction is delivered through three major components of classroom and laboratory instruction, supervised agricultural experience programs (work-based learning), and student leadership organizations such as the National FFA Organization. The Legislature further finds that opportunities to prepare for career success in the science, business and technology of agriculture should be available to every West Virginia high school student.
