- 1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
- 2 designated §6B-3-3d, relating to prohibiting lobbying by certified candidates for a seat in
- 3 the West Virginia Legislature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 3. LOBBYISTS.

§6B-3-3d. Prohibition of lobbying by candidates for State Senate or House of Delegates.

- 1 Any person who files a certificate of announcement pursuant to §3-5-7 of this code and is
- 2 <u>a candidate for State Senate or the House of Delegates, is prohibited from lobbying within the</u>
- 3 West Virginia Legislature. This prohibition extends until that person is no longer a candidate for
- 4 the State Senate or the House of Delegates, including upon defeat in the primary or general
- 5 <u>election or withdrawing from candidacy.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit lobbying within the West Virginia Legislature by persons who are registered candidates for the State Senate or House of Delegates.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
