## **Senate Bill 351**

1 A BILL to amend and reenact §64-5-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating  
2 to authorizing the Department of Health and Human Resources to promulgate a legislative  
3 rule relating to minimum licensing requirements for residential child care and treatment  
4 facilities for children and transitioning adults in West Virginia.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 5. AUTHORIZATION FOR DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN  
RESOURCES TO PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

**§64-5-1. Department of Health and Human Resources.**

1 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on July 26, 2019, authorized under the  
2 authority of §49-2-121 of this code, modified by the Department of Health and Human Resources  
3 to meet the objections of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the State  
4 Register on January 7, 2020, relating to the Department of Health and Human Resources  
5 (minimum licensing requirements for residential child care and treatment facilities for children and  
6 transitioning adults in West Virginia, [78 CSR 03](#)), is authorized.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Department of Health and Human Resources to promulgate a legislative rule relating to minimum licensing requirements for residential child care and treatment facilities for children and transitioning adults in West Virginia.
