- A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
 designated §15A-5-10, relating to the expungement of fines and fees for persons who
- 3 successfully complete the Getting Over Addicted Lifestyles Successfully Program in jail
- 4 for the purpose of obtaining a driver's license.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. BUREAU OF PRISONS AND JAILS.

§15A-5-10. Waiver of fines and fees for successfully completing the GOALS program.

- 1 Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the contrary, any individual committed
- 2 to the Division of Corrections and Rehabilitation who successfully completes the Getting Over
- 3 Addictive Lifestyles Successfully (GOALS) program shall have all fines and fees associated with
- 4 <u>his or her criminal convictions waived for the purposes of obtaining a driver's license</u>. In no case
- 5 does this apply to any restitution payments owed to any crime victim.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to remove the obstacles for obtaining a driver's license by waiving fines and fees for persons who successfully complete the GOALS program.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
