A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §6B-4-1, relating to a limitation on political activity by public employees.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 4. POLITICAL ACTIVITY BY PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

§6B-4-1. Limitation on political activity by public employees.

- 1 (a) For purposes of this section, "political activity" shall mean any activity to urge any
- 2 person to vote for or against any candidate or ballot issue or to support or oppose a political

3 committee, political party or any other organization engaged in electioneering communications or

- 4 independent expenditures as defined in §3-8-1a of this code.
- 5 (b) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, a public employee may not
- 7 <u>(1) While on duty;</u>
- 8 (2) In any room or building occupied in the discharge of official duties by an individual
- 9 <u>employed or holding office in the State of West Virginia or any agency or political subdivision</u>
- 10 thereof;
- 11 (3) While wearing a uniform or official insignia identifying the office or position of the
- 12 <u>employee; or</u>
- 13 (4) Using any vehicle owned or leased by the State of West Virginia or any agency or
- 14 instrumentality thereof.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to place a limitation on political activity by public employees.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
