1 A BILL to amend and reenact §64-9-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating  
 2 to authorizing the Board of Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to Telehealth  
 3 and Interstate Telehealth Registration for Physicians, Podiatric Physicians and Physician  
 4 Assistants.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

**ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS TO  
 PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

**§64-9-1. Board of Medicine.**

1 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on July 30, 2021, authorized under the  
 2 authority of §30-3-7 of this code, modified by the Board of Medicine to meet the objections of the  
 3 Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register on December 16,  
 4 2021, relating to the Board of Medicine (Telehealth and Interstate Telehealth Registration for  
 5 Physicians, Podiatric Physicians and Physician Assistants, [11 CSR 15](#)), is authorized with the  
 6 amendment set forth below:

7 On page 7, subsection 7.4, after the words, "standard of care" by inserting the words, "with  
 8 respect to an established patient".

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to Telehealth and Interstate Telehealth Registration for Physicians, Podiatric Physicians and Physician Assistants.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
