1 A BILL to amend and reenact §64-9-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
 2 to authorizing the Board of Osteopathic Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating
 3 to practitioner requirements for controlled substances licensure and accessing the West
 4 Virginia Controlled Substances Monitoring Program Database.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

**ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS TO
 PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

§64-9-1. Board of Osteopathic Medicine.

1 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on July 30, 2021, authorized under the
 2 authority of §60A-9-5a of this code, modified by the Board of Osteopathic Medicine to meet the
 3 objections of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register on
 4 September 24, 2021, relating to the Board of Osteopathic Medicine (Practitioner Requirements
 5 for Controlled Substances Licensure and Accessing the West Virginia Controlled Substances
 6 Monitoring Program Database, [24 CSR 07](#)), is authorized.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of Osteopathic Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to Practitioner Requirements for Controlled Substances Licensure and Accessing the West Virginia Controlled Substances Monitoring Program Database.
