Intr HB 2023R2298

A BILL to amend and reenact §17C-5-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to clarifying the offense of vehicular homicide by adding two categories; adding the termination of a pregnancy as an offense of simple negligent homicide; and increasing the penalty for gross negligent homicide.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. SERIOUS TRAFFIC OFFENSES. §17C-5-1. Negligent Simple and gross negligent homicide; penalties.

- (a) When the death of any person ensues within one year, <u>or termination of another's pregnancy</u>, as a proximate result of <u>an</u> injury received by the driving of any vehicle anywhere in this state in reckless disregard of <u>through an act or omission that constitutes simple negligence to</u> the safety of others, the person so operating such vehicle shall be guilty of simple negligent homicide.
- (b) When the death of any person ensues within one year, or termination of another's pregnancy, as a proximate result of an injury received by the driving of any vehicle anywhere in this state (*in reckless disregard*) through an act or omission that constitutes gross negligence to the safety of others, the person so operating such vehicle shall be guilty of gross negligent homicide
- (b) (c) Any person convicted of simple negligent homicide shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- (d) Any person convicted of gross negligent homicide shall be punished by imprisonment is a state correctional facility for not less than three nor more than 15 years, and shall be fined of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$3,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- (c) (e) The commissioner shall revoke the license or permit to drive and any nonresident operating privilege of any person convicted of <u>simple or gross</u> negligent homicide.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify the offense of vehicular homicide by adding two categories. The bill adds the termination of a pregnancy as an offense of simple negligent homicide. Finally, the bill increases the penalty for gross negligent homicide.
