Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

36 (g) Appropriate school staff shall be trained in first-aid, CPR, and AED use that follow

37 evidence-based guidelines set forth by the American Heart Association. Staff trained shall be

- 38 determined by the CERP, including but not limited to licensed coaches, school nurses, and athletic
- 39 trainers.
- 40 (h) The State Department of Education/local board of education may establish a procedure

41 for monitoring adherence by school boards, operators of independent charter schools, and the

- 42 governing bodies of private schools to the requirements set forth in subdivision of this section.
- 43 (i) A local and regional board of education may accept gifts, grants, and donations,
- 44 including in-kind donations designated for the purchase of an automatic external defibrillator that
- 45 meets the standards established by the United States Food and Drug Administration and for the
- 46 <u>costs incurred to inspect and maintain such device and train staff in the use of such device.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to update cardiac response plans.
