House Bill 5148

By Delegates Mallow, Jennings, DeVault, Heckert, Adkins, Willis, and Summers [Introduced January 25, 2024; Referred to the Committee on Fire Departments and Emergency Medical Services then Government Organization] A BILL to amend and reenact §5F-2-2 f the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to
 authorizing the promulgation of rules, to implement a central purchasing program to
 reduce the cost of supplies by purchasing in bulk or in a discounted format for volunteer fire
 fighters and emergency medical services first responders.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

TRANSFER ARTICLE 2. OF AGENCIES AND BOARDS. §5F-2-2. Power and authority of secretary of each department. 1 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the contrary, the secretary of each 2 department shall have plenary power and authority within and for the department to may: 3 (1) Employ and discharge within the office of the secretary employees as may be 4 necessary to carry out the functions of the secretary, which employees shall serve at the will and 5 pleasure of the secretary; 6 (2) Cause the various agencies and boards to be operated effectively, efficiently, and 7 economically and develop goals, objectives, policies, and plans that are necessary or desirable for 8 the effective, efficient, and economical operation of the department; 9 (3) Eliminate or consolidate positions, other than positions of administrators or positions of 10 board members and name a person to fill more than one position; 11 (4) Transfer permanent state employees between departments in accordance with the 12 provisions of §5F-2-7 of this code; 13 (5) Delegate, assign, transfer, or combine responsibilities or duties to or among 14 employees, other than administrators or board members; 15 (6) Reorganize internal functions or operations; 16 (7) Formulate comprehensive budgets for consideration by the Governor; 17 (8) Enter into contracts or agreements requiring the expenditure of public funds and 18 authorize the expenditure or obligation of public funds as authorized by law: Provided, That the 19 powers granted to the secretary to enter into contracts or agreements and to make expenditures or

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obligations of public funds under this provision shall <u>may</u> not exceed or be interpreted as authority
to exceed the powers granted by the Legislature to the various commissioners, directors, or board
members of the various departments, agencies, or boards that comprise and are incorporated into
each secretary's department under this chapter;

24 (9) Acquire by lease or purchase property of whatever kind or character and convey or 25 dispose of any property of whatever kind or character as authorized by law: Provided, That the 26 powers granted to the secretary to lease, purchase, convey, or dispose of such property shall be 27 exercised in accordance with §5A-3-1 et seq., §5A-10-1 et seq., and §5A-3-11 et seq. of this code: 28 Provided, however, That the powers granted to the secretary to lease, purchase, convey, or 29 dispose of such property shall may not exceed or be interpreted as authority to exceed the powers 30 granted by the Legislature to the various commissioners, directors, or board members of the 31 various departments, agencies, or boards that comprise and are incorporated into each 32 secretary's department under this chapter;

33 (10) Conduct internal audits;

34 (11) Supervise internal management;

(12) Promulgate rules, as defined in §29A-1-2 of this code, to implement and make
effective the powers, authority, and duties granted and imposed by the provisions of this chapter in
accordance with the provisions of Chapter 29A of this code;

38 (13) Grant or withhold written consent to the proposal of any rule, as defined in §29A-1-2 of
39 this code, by any administrator, agency, or board within the department. Without written consent,
40 no proposal for a rule shall may have any force or effect;

41 (14) Delegate to administrators the duties of the secretary as the secretary may deem
42 appropriate, from time to time, to facilitate execution of the powers, authority, and duties delegated
43 to the secretary;

44 (15) Enter into memoranda of understanding; and

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(16) Promulgate rules, as defined in §29A-1-2 of this code, to implement and make

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46 effective the powers, authority, and duties granted and imposed by the provisions of this chapter to 47 develop a central purchasing program to reduce the cost of supplies by purchasing in bulk or in a 48 discounted format for volunteer fire fighters and emergency medical services first responders; and 49 (16) (17) Take any other action involving or relating to internal management not otherwise 50 prohibited by law. 51 (b) The secretaries of the departments shall engage in a comprehensive review of the 52 practices, policies, and operations of the agencies and boards within their departments to 53 determine the feasibility of cost reductions and increased efficiency which may be achieved 54 therein, including, but not limited to, the following: 55 (1) The elimination, reduction, and restriction of the state's vehicle or other transportation 56 fleet: 57 (2) The elimination, reduction, and restriction of state government publications, including 58 annual reports, informational materials, and promotional materials; 59 (3) The termination or rectification of terms contained in lease agreements between the 60 state and private sector for offices, equipment, and services; 61 (4) The adoption of appropriate systems for accounting, including consideration of an 62 accrual basis financial accounting and reporting system; 63 (5) The adoption of revised procurement practices to facilitate cost-effective purchasing 64 procedures, including consideration of means by which domestic businesses may be assisted to 65 compete for state government purchases; and 66 (6) The computerization of the functions of the state agencies and boards. 67 (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section, none of the 68 powers granted to the secretaries shall may be exercised by the secretary if to do so would violate 69 or be inconsistent with the provisions of any federal law or regulation, any federal-state program or 70 federally delegated program or jeopardize the approval, existence, or funding of any program. 71 (d) The layoff and recall rights of employees within the classified service of the state as

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72 provided in §29-6-10(5) and §29-6-10(6) of this code shall be limited to the organizational unit 73 within the agency or board and within the occupational group established by the classification and 74 compensation plan for the classified service of the agency or board in which the employee was 75 employed prior to the agency or board's transfer or incorporation into the department: Provided, 76 That the employee shall possess the qualifications established for the job class. The duration of 77 recall rights provided in this subsection shall be limited to two years or the length of tenure. 78 whichever is less. Except as provided in this subsection, nothing contained in this section shall be 79 construed to abridge the rights of employees within the classified service of the state as provided 80 in §29-6-10 and §29-6-10a of this code.

- 81 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the contrary, the secretary of each
- 82 department shall cooperate with the State Resiliency Office to the fullest extent practicable to
- 83 assist that office in fulfilling its duties.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the promulgation of rules, to implement a central purchasing program to reduce the cost of supplies by purchasing in bulk or in a discounted format for volunteer fire fighters and emergency medical services first responders.
