A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
designated §18B-22-1, §18B-22-2, §18B-22-3, and §18B-22-4, all relating to requiring
publicly funded medical schools to teach the most current evidence-based, life-saving
methods including abortion pill reversal; providing definitions; setting forth consequences
for noncompliance of standard education practices; and providing finding that this article is
necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

## ARTICLE 22. PUBLICLY-FUNDED MEDICAL SCHOOLS TO TEACH THE MOST CURRENT EVIDENCE-BASED, LIFE-SAVING METHODS INCLUDING ABORTION PILL REVERSAL.

16 (2) Therefore, the Legislature finds and declares it necessary to require all publicly-funded

17 medical schools to teach standard high-risk pregnancy treatment methods including abortion pill

- 18 reversal, treatment of ectopic pregnancies, and miscarriage treatment.
- 19 (3) The Legislature also finds and declares that:
- 20 (a) Unfortunately, some preborn children develop prenatal conditions which are
- 21 <u>considered life-limiting, where the preborn child will not survive birth or survive long after birth;</u>
- 22 (b) The majority of prenatal diagnoses for life-limiting conditions are false positives; and
- 23 (c) Parents are known to process grief and heal from the loss of their child leading to better
- 24 mental health outcomes when they are allowed to see their child after birth.
- 25 (4) Therefore, the Legislature finds and declares it necessary to require all publicly-funded
- 26 medical schools to teach perinatal hospice as an essential part of pre and postnatal care.

### §18B-22-2.

Definitions.

- 1 <u>As used in this article:</u>
- 2 <u>"Abortion pill reversal" means the procedure developed by Dr. George Delgado, MD where</u>

3 <u>high dose oral progesterone is prescribed to a woman within 72 hours of taking mifepristone to</u>

4 reverse the effects of the medication abortion via competitive enzyme inhibition.

- 5 "Ectopic pregnancy treatment" means to the following procedures: salpingostomy,
- 6 <u>salpingectomy, or treatment via methotrexate.</u>
- 7 "Informed consent" means the process in which a physician conveys the risks, benefits
- 8 and alternatives to a procedure, especially medication abortion.
- 9 "Medication abortion" means the two-pill process of mifepristone or misoprostol (or any
- 10 <u>medication or combination developed thereafter) in which the hormone progesterone is blocked</u>
- 11 <u>during a pregnancy with the intention of ending the life of a preborn child.</u>

12 "Miscarriage treatment" means the use if a dilation and curettage procedure to be used

13 only in the case where first line of treatment procedures including expectant and medical

- 14 <u>management are ineffective.</u>
- 15 <u>"Perinatal hospice" means palliative care provided to preborn children who are expected to</u>
- 16 <u>be born with life-limiting conditions but are given the opportunity at life, allowing parents to be</u>
- 17 parents.

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- 18 "Publicly-funded medical school" means any medical education institution which received
- 19 local, state, or federal funding.

#### §18B-22-3. Consequences for Noncompliance of Standard Education Practices.

- Any publicly-funded medical school which does not comply and implement standard
- 2 <u>education practices by aiding in the education of their students regarding abortion pill reversal</u>
- 3 shall face the possibility of losing state funding following review by the Legislative Oversight
- 4 <u>Commission on Education Accountability.</u>

### §18B-22-4. Safety clause.

- 1 The Legislature hereby finds, determines, and declares that this article is necessary for the
- 2 immediate preservation, of the public peace, health, or safety.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require publicly-funded medical schools to teach the most current evidence-based, life-saving methods including abortion pill reverse.
