1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
2 designated §30-29-15, relating to prohibiting law-enforcement officers with less than
3 academy training from writing citations for traffic offenses on the interstate.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 29. LAW-ENFORCEMENT TRAINING AND EDUCATION.

**§30-29-15. Officers with less than academy training are prohibited from writing citations for
traffic offenses on the interstate.**

1 Any law enforcement officer whose training does not include successful completion and
2 graduation from the academy shall be prohibited from writing citations for traffic offenses on the
3 interstates of West Virginia.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit law enforcement officers with less than academy training from writing citations for traffic offenses on the interstate.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
