1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, 2 designated §15A-12-9, relating to requiring the West Virginia Fusion Center to create the 3 cold case database; defining terms; requiring law-enforcement agencies to provide 4 required information; explaining the types of cases to be included in the cold case 5 database; explaining the state agency developing the cold case database; delineating the 6 information that must be provided for inclusion in the cold case database for each 7 investigation; and delineating the information that may be provided for inclusion in the cold 8 case database for each investigation if applicable to either the victim of the crime or the 9 suspect in the crime.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 12. WEST VIRGINIA FUSION CENTER.

§15A-12-9. Cold case database.

- 1 (a) As used in this section:
- 2 <u>"CODIS" means the Combined DNA Index System;</u>
- 3 "Cold case" means any investigation into a qualifying crime, a missing person, or

4 <u>unidentified human remains where all investigative leads have been exhausted and the crime</u>

- 5 remains unsolved;
- 6 <u>"Database" means the cold case database;</u>
- 7 "NAMUS" means the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System:
- 8 <u>"NCIC" means the National Crime Information Center;</u>
- 9 "NCMEC" means the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children;
- 10 "Qualifying crime" means felony offenses set forth in §61-2-1 et seq., §61-3-1, §61-3-2,
- 11 §61-3-7, §61-3C-14b, §61-3E-1 et seq., §61-8-1 et seq., §61-8A-1 et seq., §61-8B-1 et seq., §61-
- 12 8C-1 et seq., and §61-8D-1 et seq. of this code; and
- 13 "<u>ViCAP</u>" means the Violence Crime Apprehension Program.

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- 14 (b) The West Virginia Fusion Center shall develop a secure database that contains all
- 15 information related to each cold case in any jurisdiction in the state.
- 16 (c) The West Virginia Fusion Center shall adopt policies and procedures to collect
- 17 information for the database and for its maintenance.
- 18 (d) Each law-enforcement agency in the state and the State Fire Marshal's Fire
- 19 Investigation Division shall provide the information required by the West Virginia Fusion Center
- 20 for inclusion in the database for each cold case. Each law-enforcement agency and the office of
- 21 the State Fire Marshal shall maintain its physical evidence and investigation files for each cold
- 22 case until the investigation is resolved.
- 23 (e) Information to be collected and maintained in the cold case database. Each law-
- 24 enforcement agency in the state and the Fire Marshal's Fire Investigation Division shall provide a
- 25 written report or other information to the West Virginia Fusion Center for inclusion in the database
- 26 <u>containing the following:</u>
- 27 <u>(1) The victim's:</u>
- 28 <u>(A) Name;</u>
- 29 (B) Gender;
- 30 <u>(C) Race;</u>
- 31 (D) Ethnicity; and
- 32 (E) Date of birth;
- 33 (2) The ViCAP number if the case has been entered into the ViCAP system;
- 34 (3) The NCMEC number if the case has been entered into the NCMEC system;
- 35 (4) Whether the case was entered into the NAMUS system;
- 36 (5) The NCIC number if entered into the NCIC system;
- 37 (6) The Medical Examiner case number;
- 38 (7) Whether a probative, unanalyzed suspect referenced DNA is available;

- 39 (8) Whether a probative crime scene DNA profile from the putative perpetrator has been
- 40 <u>uploaded to CODIS;</u>
- 41 (9) Whether reference DNA from the victim is available;
- 42 (10) The West Virginia State Police Forensic Lab case number;
- 43 (11) The name of the agency investigating the case:
- 44 (12) The investigating agency's phone number;
- 45 (13) The agency case number;
- 46 (14) Whether the victim was a juvenile or adult victim at the time the crime occurred;
- 47 (15) The date the crime was reported to the investigating agency;
- 48 (16) The date or approximate date the victim was last seen;
- 49 (17) The date or approximate date of death:
- 50 (18) The cause or manner of death;
- 51 (19) The location where the body was found:
- 52 (20) Whether a weapon was used, and the type of weapon used;
- 53 (21) Whether the following evidence is available:
- 54 (A) Fingerprints;
- 55 (B) Palm prints;
- 56 (C) Latent prints;
- 57 (D) Dental records;
- 58 (E) Shell casings; or
- 59 (F) Other physical evidence;
- 60 (22) Whether a suspect or person of interest has been identified;
- 61 (23) Scars, marks, and tattoos and any other unique distinguishing features of any
- 62 <u>suspects or persons of interest;</u>
- 63 (24) A case narrative; and
- 64 (25) Any other additional information that is pertinent to the case.

- 65 (f) The following information may be entered if applicable to either the victim or the
- 66 <u>suspect, but the law-enforcement agency shall specify which individual is being referenced:</u>
- 67 (1) Vehicle information;
- 68 <u>(2) Aliases;</u>
- 69 (3) Associated case addresses:
- 70 (4) Associated phone numbers;
- 71 (5) Associated names;
- 72 (6) Case photos or composite drawings at the discretion of the investigating agency; and
- 73 (7) Any other additional information that is pertinent to the case.
- 74 (g) The West Virginia Fusion Center shall maintain the information contained within the
- 75 database indefinitely.
