A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new article,
designated §19-40-1, relating to the Food Safety Act of 2025; prohibiting persons or
entities from offering for human consumption food products that contain certain
substances; and establishing civil penalties for violation of section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 40. FOOD SAFETY ACT OF 2025.

§19-40-1. Prohibited substances in food products; penalties.

- 1 (a) Commencing January 1, 2027, a person or entity shall not manufacture, sell, deliver,
- 2 <u>distribute, hold, or offer for sale, in commerce a food product for human consumption that contains</u>
- 3 <u>any of the following substances:</u>
- 4 (1) Potassium bromate; and
- 5 <u>(2) Propylparaben.</u>
- 6 (b) (1) Upon an action brought by the Attorney General, a municipal attorney, or a
- 7 prosecuting attorney, a person or entity that violates subsection (a) of this section shall be liable for
- 8 a civil penalty not to exceed \$5,000 for a first violation, and not to exceed \$10,000 for each
- 9 <u>subsequent violation.</u>
- 10 (2) This section does not impair or impede any other rights, causes of action, claims, or
- 11 defenses available under any other law. The remedies provided in this section are cumulative with
- 12 <u>any other remedies available under any other law.</u>

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the Food Safety Act of 2025, prohibiting persons or entities from offering for human consumption food products that contain certain substances; and establishing civil penalties for violation.
