FROM PASSAGE

Senator Helmick, from the committee of conference on matters of disagreement between the two houses, as to

Eng. Com. Sub. for Senate Bill No. 150, Budget bill, making appropriations of public money out of the Treasury in accordance with section fifty-one, article VI of the Constitution.

Submitted the following report, which was received:

Your committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two houses as to the amendment of the House to Engrossed Com. Sub. for Senate Bill No. 150 having met, after full and free conference, have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective houses, as follows:

That both houses recede from their respective positions as to the amendment of the House, striking out everything after the enacting clause, and agree to the same as follows:

TITLE I-GENERAL PROVISIONS.

1 Section 1. General policy.—The purpose of this bill is to 2 appropriate money necessary for the economical and efficient 3 discharge of the duties and responsibilities of the state and its 4 agencies during the fiscal year two thousand nine.

1 Sec. 2. Definitions.-For the purpose of this bill:

2 "Governor" shall mean the Governor of the State of West

3 Virginia.

4 "Code" shall mean the Code of West Virginia, one thousand nine5 hundred thirty-one, as amended.

6 "Spending unit" shall mean the department, bureau, division, 7 office, board, commission, agency or institution to which an 8 appropriation is made.

9 The "fiscal year two thousand nine" shall mean the period from 10 the first day of July, two thousand eight, through the thirtieth day 11 of June, two thousand nine.

"General revenue fund" shall mean the general operating fund of the state and includes all moneys received or collected by the state except as provided in section two, article two, chapter twelve of the code or as otherwise provided.

16 "Special revenue funds" shall mean specific revenue sources 17 which by legislative enactments are not required to be accounted for 18 as general revenue, including federal funds.

19 "From collections" shall mean that part of the total 20 appropriation which must be collected by the spending unit to be available for expenditure. If the authorized amount of collections 21 22 is not collected, the total appropriation for the spending unit shall be reduced automatically by the amount of the deficiency in the 23 24 collections. If the amount collected exceeds the amount designated "from collections," the excess shall be set aside in a special 25 26 surplus fund and may be expended for the purpose of the spending unit

27 as provided by article two, chapter eleven-b of the code.

Sec. 3. Classification of appropriations.—An appropriation for: "Personal services" shall mean salaries, wages and other compensation paid to full-time, part-time and temporary employees of the spending unit but shall not include fees or contractual payments paid to consultants or to independent contractors engaged by the spending unit.

7 Unless otherwise specified, appropriations for "personal8 services" shall include salaries of heads of spending units.

9 "Annual increment" shall mean funds appropriated for "eligible 10 employees" and shall be disbursed only in accordance with article 11 five, chapter five of the code.

12 Funds appropriated for "annual increment" shall be transferred 13 to "personal services" or other designated items only as required. "Employee benefits" shall mean social security matching, 14 15 workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, pension and retirement contributions, public employees insurance matching, 16 personnel fees or any other benefit normally paid by the employer as 17 18 a direct cost of employment. Should the appropriation be insufficient to cover such costs, the remainder of such cost shall 19 be transferred by each spending unit from its "personal services" 20 line item or its "unclassified" line item or other appropriate line 21 item to its "employee benefits" line item. If there is no 22 23 appropriation for "employee benefits," such costs shall be paid by

24 each spending unit from its "personal services" line item, its 25 "unclassified" line item or other appropriate line item. Each 26 spending unit is hereby authorized and required to make such payments 27 in accordance with the provisions of article two, chapter eleven-b 28 of the code.

"BRIM Premiums" shall mean the amount charged as consideration for insurance protection and includes the present value of projected losses and administrative expenses. Premiums are assessed for coverages, as defined in the applicable policies, for claims arising from, inter alia, general liability, wrongful acts, property, professional liability and automobile exposures.

35 Should the appropriation for "BRIM Premiums" be insufficient to 36 cover such cost, the remainder of such costs shall be transferred by 37 each spending unit from its "personal services" line item, its 38 "employee benefit" line item, its "unclassified" line item or any 39 other appropriate line item to "BRIM Premiums" for payment to the 40 Board of Risk and Insurance Management. Each spending unit is hereby 41 authorized and required to make such payments.

Each spending unit shall be responsible for all contributions, 43 payments or other costs related to coverage and claims of its 44 employees for unemployment compensation. Such expenditures shall be 45 considered an employee benefit.

46 "Current expenses" shall mean operating costs other than 47 personal services and shall not include equipment, repairs and

48 alterations, buildings or lands.

Each spending unit shall be responsible for and charged monthly for all postage meter service and shall reimburse the appropriate revolving fund monthly for all such amounts. Such expenditures shall be considered a current expense.

53 "Equipment" shall mean equipment items which have an appreciable 54 and calculable period of usefulness in excess of one year.

TRepairs and alterations" shall mean routine maintenance and repairs to structures and minor improvements to property which do not increase the capital assets.

Buildings" shall include new construction and major alteration of existing structures and the improvement of lands and shall include shelter, support, storage, protection or the improvement of a natural condition.

62 "Lands" shall mean the purchase of real property or interest in63 real property.

64 "Capital outlay" shall mean and include buildings, lands or 65 buildings and lands, with such category or item of appropriation to 66 remain in effect as provided by section twelve, article three, 67 chapter twelve of the code.

From appropriations made to the spending units of state government, upon approval of the governor there may be transferred to a special account an amount sufficient to match federal funds under any federal act.

72 Appropriations classified in any of the above categories shall 73 be expended only for the purposes as defined above and only for the 74 spending units herein designated: Provided, That the secretary of 75 each department shall have the authority to transfer within the department those general revenue funds appropriated to the various 76 Provided, however, That no more than 77 agencies of the department: five percent of the general revenue funds appropriated to any one 78 79 agency or board may be transferred to other agencies or boards within 80 the department and no funds so transferred may be transferred to a "personal services" line: Provided further, That the secretary of 81 each department and the director, commissioner, executive secretary, 82 superintendent, chairman or any other agency head not governed by a 83 departmental secretary as established by chapter five-f of the code 84 85 shall have the authority to transfer funds appropriated to "personal services" and "employee benefits" to other lines within the same 86 account and no funds from other lines shall be transferred to the 87 "personal services" line: And provided further, That the secretary 88 89 of each department and the director, commissioner, executive 90 secretary, superintendent, chairman or any other agency head not governed by a departmental secretary as established by chapter five-f 91 of the code shall have the authority to transfer general revenue 92 93 funds appropriated to "annual increment" to other general revenue accounts within the same department, bureau or commission for the 94 purpose of providing an annual increment in accordance with article 95

96 five, chapter five of the code: And provided further, That no authority exists hereunder to transfer funds into line-items to which 97 no funds are legislatively appropriated: And provided further, That 98 if the Legislature by subsequent enactment consolidates agencies, 99 100 boards or functions, the secretary or other appropriate agency head may transfer the funds formerly appropriated to such agency, board 101 or function in order to implement such consolidation. No funds may 102 103 be transferred from a Special Revenue Account, dedicated account, 104 capital expenditure account or any other account or fund specifically 105 exempted by the Legislature from transfer, except that the use of the 106 appropriations from the State Road Fund for the office of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation is not a use other than 107 the purpose for which such funds were dedicated and is permitted. 108

Appropriations otherwise classified shall be expended only where the distribution of expenditures for different purposes cannot well be determined in advance or it is necessary or desirable to permit the spending unit the freedom to spend an appropriation for more than one of the above classifications.

1 Sec. 4. Method of expenditure.-Money appropriated by this bill, 2 unless otherwise specifically directed, shall be appropriated and 3 expended according to the provisions of article three, chapter twelve 4 of the code or according to any law detailing a procedure 5 specifically limiting that article.

1 Sec. 5. Maximum expenditures.-No authority or requirement of

2 law shall be interpreted as requiring or permitting an expenditure 3 in excess of the appropriations set out in this bill.

18 Upon the written request of the Clerk of the Senate, the auditor 19 shall transfer amounts between items of the total appropriation in 20 order to protect or increase the efficiency of the service.

21 The Clerk of the Senate, with the approval of the president, is 22 authorized to draw his or her requisitions upon the auditor, payable out of the Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the senate, for any 23 bills for supplies and services that may have been incurred by the 24 25 senate and not included in the appropriation bill, for supplies and services incurred in preparation for the opening, the conduct of the 26 business and after adjournment of any regular or extraordinary 27 28 session, and for the necessary operation of the senate offices, the requisitions for which are to be accompanied by bills to be filed with 29 the auditor. 30

The Clerk of the Senate, with the written approval of the president, or the President of the Senate shall have authority to an employ such staff personnel during any session of the Legislature as shall be needed in addition to staff personnel authorized by the senate resolution adopted during any such session. The Clerk of the Senate, with the written approval of the president, or the President of the Senate shall have authority to employ such staff personnel

38 between sessions of the Legislature as shall be needed, the 39 compensation of all staff personnel during and between sessions of the 40 Legislature, notwithstanding any such senate resolution, to be fixed 41 by the President of the Senate. The clerk is hereby authorized to 42 draw his or her requisitions upon the auditor for the payment of all 43 such staff personnel for such services, payable out of the 44 appropriation for Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees 45 or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the senate.

For duties imposed by law and by the senate, the Clerk of the For duties imposed by law and by the senate, the Clerk of the Senate shall be paid a monthly salary as provided by the senate resolution, unless increased between sessions under the authority of the president, payable out of the appropriation for Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the senate.

52 The distribution of the blue book shall be by the office of the 53 Clerk of the Senate and shall include seventy-five copies for each 54 member of the Legislature and two copies for each classified and 55 approved high school and junior high or middle school and one copy for 56 each elementary school within the state.

The Clerk of the 34 House of Delegates is hereby authorized to draw requisitions upon the 35 auditor for such services, payable out of the appropriation for the Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees or Current 36 37 Expenses and Contingent Fund of the house of delegates.

For duties imposed by law and by the house of delegates, including salary allowed by law as keeper of the rolls, the Clerk of the House of Delegates shall be paid a monthly salary as provided in the house resolution, unless increased between sessions under the authority of the speaker, with the approval of the house committee on rules, and payable out of the appropriation for Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the house of delegates.

Awards for claims against the state.-There are hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2009, from the fund as designated, in the 4 specified, general revenue funds in the amount of 5 amounts as \$1,886,796, special revenue funds in the amount of \$558,413, and state 6 road funds in the amount of \$713,890 for payment of claims against the 7 state. 8

9 Sec. 9. Special revenue appropriations.-There are hereby appropriated for expenditure during the fiscal year two thousand nine 10 11 appropriations made by general law from special revenues which are not 12 paid into the state fund as general revenue under the provisions of section two, article two, chapter twelve of the code: Provided, That 13 none of the money so appropriated by this section shall be available 14 for expenditure except in compliance with and in conformity to the 15 16 provisions of articles two and three, chapter twelve and article two, 17 chapter eleven-b of the code, unless the spending unit has filed with 18 the director of the budget and the legislative auditor prior to the 19 beginning of each fiscal year:

20 (a) An estimate of the amount and sources of all revenues accruing21 to such fund;

(b) A detailed expenditure schedule showing for what purposes the fund is to be expended.

State improvement fund appropriations.-Bequests or 24 Sec. 10. 25 donations of nonpublic funds, received by the governor on behalf of 26 the state during the fiscal year two thousand nine, for the purpose of making studies and recommendations relative to improvements of the 27 administration and management of spending units in the executive 28 29 branch of state government, shall be deposited in the state treasury in a separate account therein designated state improvement fund. 30

There are hereby appropriated all moneys so deposited during the fiscal year two thousand nine to be expended as authorized by the governor, for such studies and recommendations which may encompass any problems of organization, procedures, systems, functions, powers or duties of a state spending unit in the executive branch, or the betterment of the economic, social, educational, health and general welfare of the state or its citizens.

38 Sec. 11. Specific funds and collection accounts.-A fund or 39 collection account which by law is dedicated to a specific use is 40 hereby appropriated in sufficient amount to meet all lawful demands 41 upon the fund or collection account and shall be expended according to 42 the provisions of article three, chapter twelve of the code.

43 Sec. 12. Appropriations for refunding erroneous payment.-Money that 44 has been erroneously paid into the state treasury is hereby 45 appropriated out of the fund into which it was paid, for refund to the 46 proper person.

47 When the officer authorized by law to collect money for the state

48 finds that a sum has been erroneously paid, he or she shall issue his 49 or her requisition upon the auditor for the refunding of the proper 50 amount. The auditor shall issue his or her warrant to the treasurer 51 and the treasurer shall pay the warrant out of the fund into which the 52 amount was originally paid.

53 Sinking fund deficiencies. - There is hereby appropriated Sec. 13. to the governor a sufficient amount to meet any deficiencies that may 54 55 arise in the mortgage finance bond insurance fund of the West Virginia housing development fund which is under the supervision and control of 56 the municipal bond commission as provided by section twenty-b, article 57 58 eighteen, chapter thirty-one of the code, or in the funds of the municipal bond commission because of the failure of any state agency 59 for either general obligation or revenue bonds or any local taxing 60 61 district for general obligation bonds to remit funds necessary for the payment of interest and sinking fund requirements. 62 The governor is authorized to transfer from time to time such amounts to the municipal 63 bond commission as may be necessary for these purposes. 64

The municipal bond commission shall reimburse the state of West Virginia through the governor from the first remittance collected from the West Virginia housing development fund or from any state agency or local taxing district for which the governor advanced funds, with interest at the rate carried by the bonds for security or payment of which the advance was made.

71 Sec. 14. Appropriations for local governments.-There are hereby

72 appropriated for payment to counties, districts and municipal 73 corporations such amounts as will be necessary to pay taxes due 74 counties, districts and municipal corporations and which have been 75 paid into the treasury:

76 (a) For redemption of lands;

77 (b) By public service corporations;

78 (c) For tax forfeitures.

**Sec. 15.** Total appropriations.-Where only a total sum is appropriated to a spending unit, the total sum shall include personal services, annual increment, employee benefits, current expenses, repairs and alterations, equipment and capital outlay, where not otherwise specifically provided and except as otherwise provided in TITLE I-GENERAL PROVISIONS, Sec. 3.

Sec. 16. General school fund.-The balance of the proceeds of the general school fund remaining after the payment of the appropriations made by this act is appropriated for expenditure in accordance with section sixteen, article nine-a, chapter eighteen of the code.

### TITLE III-ADMINISTRATION.

Section 1. Appropriations conditional.-The expenditure of the appropriations made by this act, except those appropriations made to the legislative and judicial branches of the state government, are conditioned upon the compliance by the spending unit with the requirements of article two, chapter eleven-b of the code.

6 Where spending units or parts of spending units have been absorbed

7 by or combined with other spending units, it is the intent of this act 8 that appropriations and reappropriations shall be to the succeeding or 9 later spending unit created, unless otherwise indicated.

10 Sec. 2. Constitutionality.-If any part of this act is declared 11 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, its decision 12 shall not affect any portion of this act which remains, but the 13 remaining portion shall be in full force and effect as if the portion 14 declared unconstitutional had never been a part of the act.
