The Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee met in the Senate Judiciary Committee Room at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, December 19, 2019. The meeting was called to order by the Chair, Senator Maynard. A silent roll call was taken by the Clerk to establish a quorum, as reflected above. Staff present included: Arlie Hubbard, House Counsel; Cindy Dellinger, House Counsel; Robert Akers, House Counsel; James Fuerhoff, Director of Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee; and Felisha Sutherland, Committee Clerk.

The first order of business was consideration of the following legislative rules:

On page 2, Section 3.7, following the word “Veterinary”, by inserting the word “Technician”;

On page 2, Section 3.7, by striking out “\$80.00” and inserting in lieu thereof “\$5.00”;

On page 2, Section 3.8, by striking out “\$25.00” and inserting in lieu thereof “\$2.00”;

On page 2, Section 3.9, following the word “inactive”, by striking out the word “license” and inserting in lieu thereof the word “registration”;

And,

On page 2, Section 3.9, by striking out “\$80.00” and inserting in lieu thereof “\$6.00”.
