The Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee met in the Senate Judiciary Committee Room at 2:00 p.m. on Monday, December 5, 2022. The meeting was called to order by the Chair, Senator Sypolt. A silent roll call was taken by the Clerk to establish a quorum, as reflected above. Staff present included: Cindy Dellinger, Senate Counsel; Adair Burgess, Director of Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee; and Felisha Sutherland, Committee Clerk.

Chairman Sypolt recognized Delegate Steele for the purpose of a motion to approve the minutes from October 3, 2022. The motion was adopted.

 Cindy Dellinger, Senate Counsel, explained her abstract on the proposed rule by the Department of Health and Human Resources, *All-Payer Claim Database* – *Submission Manual*, <u>114A CSR 03</u>, and responded to questions from the Committee.

With leave of the Committee, Carol Stocks, West Virginia University representative and liaison to the Cabinet Secretary's Office, Department of Health and Human Resources, responded to questions from the Committee.

On motion, Delegate Steele moved that staff prepare the Committee's report and submit the report to the Clerk's office of each House; draft a Bill of

Authorization for each rule contained in the report; and cause the bills to be introduced in each house with the Chairs of the Committee as sponsors in their respective houses. The motion was adopted.
