#### West Virginia's Growing Broadband Industry

Projects announced in 2022 will result in nearly 3,000 miles of new fiber infrastructure, providing high-speed broadband access to more than 38,000 targeted homes and businesšes.

West Virginia has awarded \$103 million in ARPA funding to date, including:

- \$70 million in Capital Projects Funds, and \$33 million in SLFRF funds

Internet Service Providers in West Virginia have dedicated matching funds exceeding \$44 million for a total investment of more than \$147 million in 24 projects, exceeding the required match rate of 25 percent.

ISP Partners report more than 125,000 new and upgraded service connections since 2021.



## West Virginia Targeted Addresses

- Addresses that are estimated to have no current access to internet service with at least 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload (25/3 Mbps) speeds, not counting access to satellite or mobile wireless internet, and
- Not in an area with a binding commitment to a state, federal, or local entity to deliver massmarket broadband service of at least 25/3 Mbps, not counting commitments to expand access to satellite or mobile wireless internet.
- All other addresses not classified as "Targeted" are classified as "Other."








#### 2022 Combined Broadband Expansion in West Virginia










# **FCC National Broadband Map**

#### **Submit a Location Challenge**

 If a location is available on the map that includes inaccurate information, navigate to "Location Challenge" in the side-panel to complete the form.

#### **Submit an Availability Challenge**

- After searching a location, select "Availability Challenge" in the side-panel.
- Select the provider (ISP) you wish to challenge.
- Complete the form to dispute the provider's claim on service availability.
- Submit a separate challenge for each provider, if multiple providers are listed incorrectly.



#### **Action Items – Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)**

As of January 9 87,400 West Virginians have enrolled in ACP benefits.

A *household* is eligible if one member of the household meets at least *one* of the criteria below:

- Income at or below 200% of <u>Federal Poverty Guidelines</u>;
- Assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or <u>Lifeline</u>;
- Free and reduced school lunch or school breakfast, such as USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Eligibility for provider's existing low-income program.
