## **MINUTES**

The Joint Legislative Oversight Commission on State Water Resources met on Tuesday, September 12, 2023, at 12:00 p.m. in the House Finance Committee Room. The meeting was called to order by Delegate Riley, Co-Chairman, and the Clerk took a silent roll to establish a quorum. Quorum was not present.
