Committee on Environment, Infrastructure, and Technology

Minutes for March 12, 2025, 3:00 PM

Pursuant to the call of the Chair, the Committee on Environment, Infrastructure, and Technology met on March 12, 2025, 3:00 PM, in the House Judiciary Committee Room 410-M.

Members present: Delegates D. Cannon, Dillon, Eldridge, Hansen, Hillenbrand, Holstein, Linville, Moore, Parsons.

Members absent: Delegates Bridges, Green.

A silent roll call being taken, the presence of a quorum was established.

On motion of Delegate Hillenbrand, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The next item on the agenda was the consideration of bills on Markup and Passage.

H. B. 2181, Relating to county or city sewer projects for privately owned sewers that are newly installed.

Counsel explained the bill, there were no questions or discussion. Vice-Chairman Hillenbrand moved an amendment to the bill and counsel explained the amendment. Questions and discussion followed. Then the Vice-Chairman offered an amendment to the amendment. After an explanation of the amendment to the amendment, Chairman Linville put the question before the Committee on its adoption. The motion was adopted. The question then came to adopt the amended amendment. Upon voting the yays and nays, division was called, and a show of hands was demanded. The motion was lost with Chairman Linville breaking the tie vote. The Chairman then looked to the Vice-Chairman for a motion to move the bill to the Standing Committee and with the recommendation that it do pass. The motion was adopted.

Next on the agenda are bills in the Committee Hearing Stage.

H. B. 2736, Relating generally to Underground Facilities Damage prevention.

Chairman Linville vacated the Chair and explained the bill. There were no questions or discussion. The Chairman then returned to the Chair and declared the bill moved to Markup and Discussion.

H. B. 3170, Approved sewage systems for rental property.

With there being no sponsor present to explain the bill. The Chairman asked unanimous consent to move this bill to the next scheduled meeting.

With there being no further business to come before the committee. Chairman Linville looked to the Vice-Chairman for a motion to adjourn.

On Motion of Delegate Hillenbrand the committee adjourned.
