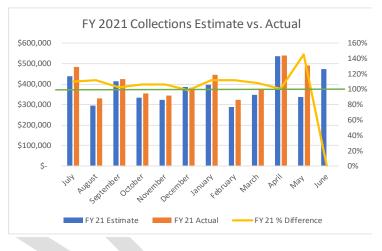

General Revenue

General Revenue collections for May totaled \$491,001,547, **exceeding** the monthly estimate of \$338,756,000 by \$152,245,547. Total year to date General Revenue collections are \$4,492,274,517.

As of the end of May the state has collected 98% of its total estimated yearly revenue of \$4,574,514,000. At this time, the state should have collected 90% of its yearly revenue. This current trend puts the state **on track** for meeting yearly revenue estimates.

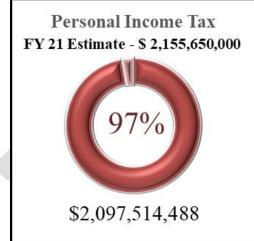
Personal Income Tax

Personal income tax (PIT) collections for the month were \$268,949,622. This figure is \$127,549,622 **above** the May estimate of \$141,400,000*. The total year to date personal income tax collections for fiscal year 2021 are \$2,097,514,488.

Fiscal Year 2021 PIT YTD Performance Exceeding estimates by \$144,664,488



As of the end of May the state has collected 97% of its total estimated PIT yearly collections of \$2,155,650,000. At this time the state should have collected 91% of its PIT yearly collections. This current trend puts the state **on track** for meeting the PIT yearly collections estimate. **The deadline for filing a 2020 individual tax return was pushed back to May 17, 2021.*

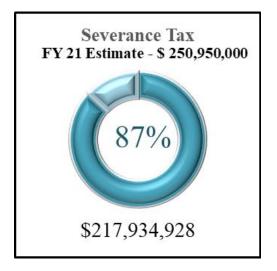
Severance Tax

Severance tax collections for May were \$23,434,121. This figure is \$8,265,879 **below** the monthly estimate of \$31,700,000. Total severance tax collections for fiscal year 2021 are \$217,934,928.

As of the end of May the state has collected 87% of its total yearly collections of \$250,950,000. At this time the state should have collected 82%* of its yearly severance tax collections. This current trend puts the state **on track** for meeting the yearly severance tax collection estimate.

*Severance Tax estimated collections for the first 6 months of the yearly were \$78,000,000, and for the last six months of the year are estimated at \$172,950,000.

Other Notable Collections

Consumer Sales and Service Tax collections for the month were \$29,334,992 **above** the May estimate of \$120,500,000 at \$149,834,992.

Tobacco Products Tax collections for May were \$12,435,155. These collections were **below** the monthly estimate of \$12,700,000 by \$264,845.

Lottery

Total gross lottery collections for April were \$115,828,000. This figure is \$33,338,000 **above** the monthly estimate of \$82,490,000. Total gross lottery collections for fiscal year 2021 are \$961,043,000.

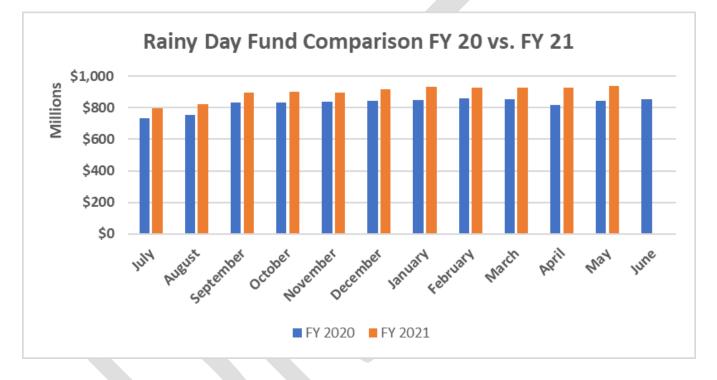
