The Claimants filed a wrongful death action against the Respondent after their decedents were killed in an automobile accident. Certain facts and circumstances of the claims were agreed to by the parties to facilitate a settlement. The accident occurred on August 31, 2014 as the decedents were travelling on West Virginia Route 52 at Switchback in McDowell County. The driver lost control of the vehicle, which left the roadway and then collided with the end of a guardrail adjacent to the road. The Respondent was responsible for the maintenance of West Virginia State Route 52, including the guardrail, on the date of the incident. As a result of this accident, both the driver, Raheem Bonds, and the passenger, Lauren Perdue, died from their injuries. Alcohol and drugs were a factor in the cause of this accident as cited by the investigating officer; the decedents died from injuries caused by the trauma of the collision of the vehicle with the end of the guardrail located on the right of way owned by the Respondent. The Claimants alleged that the Respondent was negligent in its use of a breakaway cable terminal (BCT) on this guardrail and should have replaced it. The Respondent denied any negligence and cited federal highway rules and regulations which determined the requirements for replacing BCT's; these regulations did not require the replacement of the BCT's on West Virginia Route 52. The position of the Respondent was that the proximate cause of this tragic accident was the impaired driver's negligent and reckless operation of the vehicle. All parties involved acknowledge the need for the West Virginia Legislature to approve the final settlement payments of \$75,000.00 to each Claimant to fully resolve the claim. The Commission finds the sum of \$75,000.00 to each Claimant is fair and reasonable.

The driver lost control of the vehicle, which left the roadway and then collided with the end of a guardrail adjacent to the road. As a result of this accident, both the driver, Raheem Bonds, and the passenger, Lauren Perdue, died from their injuries. The Commission believes the sum of \$75,000.00 to each Claimant is fair and reasonable.

Code §14-2-13a and under this Commission's general jurisdiction, seeking damages for the wrongful conviction and for his loss of liberty associated with serving 13 years of imprisonment for the wrongful conviction of first degree murder, which was wrongly imposed upon him by the Circuit Court of Pocahontas County. In light of the nature of the deprivation suffered by the Claimant, and after considering the unique facts and circumstances of each of his claims, and the record in its entirety, including the findings of the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia, the Commission finds that an award in the amount of \$1,250,000.00 should be made to Claimant, Davie Lee Hurt.
