Dear WV State Auditor's Office, WV Joint Committee on Government & Finance, and WV Association of Convention & Visitor Bureaus,

As you are aware with the passing of Senate Bill 488 during the 2021 West Virginia Legislature's Regular Session several new requirements have been implemented on CVBs to qualify for distributions of Hotel Occupancy taxes by the county(s) and or the municipality(s) we serve.

In compliance with W.Va. Code §7-18-13a, CVBs are to now report to the WVSAO, the WV Joint Committee on Government & Finance, and the WVACVB 90 days following the end of the CVB's fiscal year the following:

- Balance sheet annually,
- Income statement annually, and
- Either an audit or a financial review triennially W.Va. Code § 7-18-14.

In addition, CVBs are to be accredited by an accrediting body such as the WV Association of Convention and Visitors Bureaus (WVACVB) W.Va. Code §7-18-13a(b) which confirms compliance with the following industry standards as follows:

- Annual budget,
- Budget allocation within the industry standard of 40% 40% 20% (Marketing, Personnel, Administrative),
- Marketing plan targeting markets outside of SO miles of their destination,
- Full time executive director,
- Physical office/ Visitor Center,
- Website, and
- Annual reporting to all the CVBs funding entities.

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the Tug Valley Area CVB, we respectfully submit the required information and confirm that Tug Valley Area CVB is in full compliance with all WV Code 7-18-13 requirements.

Dirt Days showed a profit of \$17, 111.78.

GENERAL ACCOUNT:

General Account shows you had expenses of \$40,993.99 and income/deposits of \$35,204.41, hence, you spent more than you took in, by \$5,789.58, or 11.05 % over deposits made.

The two largest expenditures, according to percentages, were Event Expense and Salaries/Wages. The two together made up 77.41% of your expenditures.

There are no fixed assets listed because I am unaware of anything purchased or owned by the CVB – office furniture or equipment, etc.


