Hazardous Waste Certification Fee Fund Financial Report Joint Committee on Government and Finance December 18, 2009

I. Summary of the Hazardous Waste Management Program

The Hazardous Waste Management Program is designated to perform site inspections, review and issue permits, provide compliance assistance, and perform related activities to ensure that hazardous waste generators and treatment, storage and disposal facilities comply with all regulatory requirements during construction, operation, and closure of said facilities. In addition, the program responds to citizen complaints and hazardous waste emergency incidents to protect public health and the environment. The program is comprised of 26 employees, made up of permit writers, inspectors, data managers, and support staff located in Charleston and six regional offices. This number represents a nearly 28 percent reduction in staff (ten FTEs) since the implementation of the hazardous waste certification fee in October 2003. The reduction is a result of attrition and reorganization.

There are approximately 2,906 active hazardous waste generating facilities within the state, including chemical manufacturers, small industrial manufacturers, and auto body repair and paint shops.

In SFY09, the program completed six compliance assistance visits, and 441 compliance evaluation visits of which 42 were hazardous waste complaint responses and 10 were hazardous waste emergency responses. There were also permitting activities, generator assistance, and program support provided to the regulated community.

The program is managed on a budget of \$2.5 million. The budget is comprised of \$1.7 million in federal grants, resulting in a required state match of \$800,000. All expenditures from the hazardous waste certification fee are used to match the federal grant. This match was previously produced from penalties assessed by hazardous waste inspectors.

II. Moving Away From Funding the Program with Penalty Monies

The amendment to WV Code 22-18 that initiated the Hazardous Waste Certification Fee was effective June 4, 2002, with a termination date of June 30, 2006. By two additional amendments, the termination date was extended to June 30, 2008 and June 30, 2010, respectively. WVDEP currently has a Bill introduced to amend WV Code 22-18 to extend the termination date to June 30, 2015. A stakeholders' group, including industry representatives, participated in drafting the initial legislation. The fee was developed to

assist DEP in supporting the Hazardous Waste Management Program on revenues other than penalties.

Title 33, Series 24 Procedural Rule to implement the fee was effective April 17, 2003. The rule set procedures for assessing and collecting the hazardous waste management fees and set the fee schedule. Unfortunately, the fees have not generated the expected revenue, and due to the shortfall of revenue, the certification fee fund was projected to reach a zero balance by state fiscal year 2010. In 2009, WVDEP amended the rule to increase the fees, and to stabilize the fee collection. The effective date of the amendment was June 1, 2009.

Account 3023, the Hazardous Waste Management Fee Fund, was created July 1, 2004 (SFY05) to house the fees, and the appropriation was set at \$100,000. In SFY05, \$68,999 was expended, primarily on personal services and benefits. There was one FTE on the account.

Effective July 1, 2006 (SFY07), the appropriation was increased to \$597,291, of which \$409,584 was set as classified, which allowed DEP to support seven FTEs on the account, as well as utilize \$187,707 in unclassified (operating expenses). The current FY'09 budget is \$599,046 with \$439,488 set as classified, and seven FTE's remain on the account.

In August 2005, to establish consistency across the agency, DEP ceased issuing administrative orders for monetary penalties under WV Code 22-18-15, and began utilizing WV Code 22-18-17 Civil Penalties and Injunctive Relief. Penalties that were collected under the WV Code 22-18-15 Administrative Enforcement actions were deposited into Account 3326 Hazardous Waste Management Fund, and used to help fund the state's share of the Hazardous Waste Management Program (state match to the US EPA RCRA3011 Grant). However, the WV Code 22-18-17 Civil Penalties program mandates that all proceeds from assessments collected pursuant to the subsection be deposited in the Account 3331 Hazardous Waste Emergency Response Fund, which limits DEP's state match sources. The DEP needs to maintain the Hazardous Waste Certification Fee to continue to generate the necessary revenue to match the RCRA3011 federal grant.

III. Fund Projection

As Section IV below depicts, the Hazardous Waste Certification Fee was not generating enough revenue to sustain the program until the rule change in 2009. The rule increased the fee assessments to the level minimally necessary to sustain the Hazardous Waste Management Program, by helping to ensure sufficient revenue to meet the matching requirements for supporting federal grants.
