#### Governor Justice:

Attached is a compilation of receipts and expenditures for the Oil and Gas Reclamation Fund and the Oil and Gas Abandoned Well Plugging Fund for Fiscal Year 2022, as required pursuant to W. Va. Code Chapter 22, Article 6, Sections 29 and 29a, respectively.

For the Oil and Gas Reclamation Fund, \$1,062,850 were collected and deposited into the fund from permit fees and other revenues. Expenditures from the fund were \$789,296 which covered personal services, three reclamation projects, and five plugging projects.

For the Oil and Gas Abandoned Well Plugging Fund, \$1,890,512 were collected and deposited into the fund from severance taxes. Expenditures from the fund were \$46,615 which covered personal services.

### Abandoned Well Plugging Program – 5-year plan

Pursuant to W. Va. Code § 22-6-29A(b)(3), the WVDEP shall submit to the Governor and the Legislature an annual report which includes a five-year plan detailing current and future projects and activities to plug and reclaim abandoned wells. For Fiscal years 2023-2027, the Office of Oil and Gas Abandoned Well Plugging Program (ABWP) will continue to expend monies from Oil and Gas Reclamation and the Abandoned Well Plugging Funds (W. Va. Code §§ 22-6-29 and 22-6-29A) to help achieve the Office's mission to restore abandoned oil and gas sites.

In general, the Office of Oil and Gas will continue to locate, identify, and inspect abandoned wells. On a priority basis, the Abandoned Well Plugging Program will prepare solicitations for well plugging projects. Current estimates project combined revenues from these funds of approximately \$3 million in FY2023. ABWP will continue the efforts from FY2022, and focus on single-well, double-well, and small packages of five for fewer wells. In doing so, OOG hopes to appeal to the widest variety of plugging contractors. ABWP anticipates plugging approximately 25 abandoned wells from the combined state revenue sources.

In addition to state funding sources, ABWP expects to receive a \$25 million grant from the U.S. Department of Interior through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) for the plugging of orphaned, abandoned wells in FY2023. DEP is currently accepting bids for regional well plugging contracts. Based on estimated plugging costs, OOG anticipates the plugging of approximately 160 wells during FY2023.

Beyond FY2023, DEP will be eligible for additional grants from the Department of Interior through the BIL. ABWP projects receiving approximately \$117 million over five years. Combined with state revenues, OOG anticipates an average annual budget of approximately \$25 million for the purpose of plugging abandoned wells. Over the period FY2023-2027, DEP expects to plug a total of approximately 800 abandoned wells.

In response to the increased workload expectations from the DOI grants, the Office of Oil and Gas has added one new Inspector Specialist position in the ABWP program and is currently in the process of hiring a Procurement Associate to further support the office in the contracting of well plugging projects.
