### FAMILY PROTECTION SERVICES BOARD

The Family Protection Services Board (FPSB) was established by the passage of the Domestic Violence Act of 1989. The seven-member board is appointed by the Governor to assure that programs working toward the elimination of domestic violence are adequately funded and provide quality services.

### ROLES OF THE FAMILY PROTECTION SERVICES BOARD

Duties of the FPSB are set forth in the W. Va. Code §48-26-301, W. Va. Code §48-26-401, and W. Va. Code §48-26-402 as well as in Legislative Rules Title 191, Series 1 through 5. These duties include, but are not limited to:

- Monitoring compliance with standards through the licensure of domestic violence programs, batterer intervention and prevention programs, and monitored visitation and exchange programs.
- Allocating the WV Family Protection Fund, generated from marriage and divorce fees, to regional licensed domestic violence programs across the state that provide shelter and outreach advocacy to victims of domestic violence and their children.
- Allocating the Domestic Violence Legal Services Fund, generated through civil court filing fees and state funds, for victims' representation in civil cases.

### **BOARD MEMBERSHIP**

The Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, appoints five members to serve three-year terms: a director of a licensed domestic violence program, a member of the West Virginia Coalition Against Domestic Violence Board of Directors, a representative of a batterer intervention and prevention program licensed by the Family Protection Services Board, a representative of the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals and a member of the public. The two additional members are the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Resources and the Chair of the Governor's Committee on Crime, Delinquency and Correction or their designees.



**LICENSED DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAMS** in 14 regional service areas provide shelter services, advocacy, outreach services and community education to all 55 counties. According to the most recent program data available, between July 1, 2021and June 30, 2022, an unduplicated total of 10,251 adults and 1,575 children received shelter and non-shelter services.

- A total of 1.561 adults and children received shelter services.
- A total of 12,699 adults and children received non-shelter services.
- 26,581 shelter nights were provided to victims and their children.
- 77,801 units of service were provided to victims and their children. A unit of service is one hour of direct contact on behalf of a client by staff. An additional 6,981.50 units of services were donated by volunteers.
- Victims received assistance in filing 6,281 domestic violence petitions.
- 1,489 educational programs for communities, schools and professionals were conducted, with 27,595 participants.

**THE WEST VIRGINIA FAMILY PROTECTION FUND** is allocated by the FPSB to licensed domestic violence programs from fees generated by marriage licenses and divorce filings in West Virginia. The funds are held in a special revenue account administered through West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. In FY2022, \$475,000 was distributed to the 14 licensed regional domestic violence programs.

**CIVIL LEGAL ASSISTANCE FUNDS** enable domestic violence victims to access legal representation. Using these funds, local licensed domestic violence programs refer victims for legal representation at protective order hearings, divorce and custody hearings, and other proceedings to enhance victim safety. Since 1999, the West Virginia Legislature has authorized funds annually for the Domestic Violence Legal Services Fund, which, along with funds generated through civil filing fees are allocated by the Family Protection Services Board. In FY2022, \$810,000 was distributed.

Legal Aid of West Virginia, through agreements with the licensed domestic violence programs and assistance from local volunteer and low fee attorneys, provided civil legal assistance to 1,237 victims through 12,979 hours of service in FY2021. In cases where Legal Aid of West Virginia is unable to represent the victim due to a conflict of interest, the West Virginia Coalition Against Domestic Violence coordinates a conflict fund and reports providing assistance in 13 cases in FY2022.

**LICENSED BATTERER INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS** (BIPPs) are designed as a series of educational classes aimed at holding batterers accountable. In FY2022, 934 batterers participated at class sites operated by 16 local licensed programs. Additionally, 325 individuals participated in BIPPs at 13 correctional centers operated by the West Virginia Division of Corrections.

**LICENSED MONITORED PARENTING AND EXCHANGE PROGRAMS** (frequently called visitation centers) enable children to safely have in-person contact with their non-custodial parents. The need for monitored visitation and exchange results from family safety issues such as domestic violence, divorce and custody disputes. During FY2022, six licensed programs provided 1,801 exchanges and visits for 197 children at 7 sites. These visits and exchanges involved 115 custodial mothers, 34 custodial fathers, 111 non-custodial mothers, 114 non-custodial fathers and 6 other adults.
