Executive Summary

Hospitals

In the aggregate, West Virginia hospitals showed a profit of \$172.5 million which was 4.3% of net patient revenue (NPR), up from \$72.8 million (1.9% of NPR) in FY 2005.

Acute Care Hospitals

The total profit for the 35 general acute care hospitals was \$123.8 million (3.5% of NPR), up from \$62.0 million (1.8% of NPR) in the prior year.

Critical Access Hospitals (CAH)

As a group, the profitability for CAHs continued to improve for the third straight year. The aggregate profit was \$3.5 million (1.4% of NPR). Excluding Jefferson Memorial which converted to CAH in December of FY 2005, the profitability drops to \$721,000. This is still an improvement over the prior year, which experienced a loss of \$1.3 million (0.6% of NPR).

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals (LTCH)

The two facilities in FY 2006 reported a profit of \$3.3 million (12.4% of NPR), compared to a loss of \$961,000 (5.7% of NPR) reported in the prior year.

Psychiatric Hospitals

The four hospitals had an aggregate loss of \$702,000 (2.0% of NPR), an improvement of \$4.5 million from the prior year's loss of \$5.2 million (18.4% of NPR).

Rehabilitation Hospitals

These hospitals (excluding the state facility that closed in June 2006) continued to demonstrate profitability. The private facilities reported profits of \$46.0 million (51.7% of

NPR) compared to \$24.7 million (26.5% of NPR) in FY 2005. The state-operated hospital had a loss of \$3.4 million (119.6% of NPR).

Other Facilities

Nursing Homes

The state's 106 nursing homes reported aggregate profits of \$32.6 million (5.0% of NPR), a decrease from the \$36.0 million reported in FY 2005.

Aggregate net patient revenue increased \$27.4 million in FY 2006; expenses increased \$31.7 million.

Home Health

Overall, home health agencies reported total losses of \$4.3 million on \$84.5 million total revenue; 33 of the 72 agencies were profitable.

Four home health agencies were acquired during FY 2006.

Hospice

Aggregate hospice profits were \$9.1 million, compared to \$5.7 million in FY 2005.

Non-operating revenue, which included contributions, exceeded income from patient services.

Behavioral Health Facilities

Seventy-three behavioral health providers reported aggregate profits of \$8.5 million, 1.8% of total revenue.

The number of facilities reporting profits increased from 43 in FY 2005 to 48 for FY 2006.

Methadone Treatment Facilities

The aggregate profit for the eight facilities was \$5.7 million, 27.6% of total revenue.

Ambulatory Surgical Centers (ASC)

Eleven reporting certified ASCs had an aggregate profit of \$5.2 million, 21.7% of total revenue.

Overview of Key Indicators

The West Virginia Health Care Authority (WVHCA) collects and disseminates financial data on health care facilities, including hospitals, nursing homes, home health agencies, hospice agencies, behavioral health centers and ambulatory surgical centers. The reporting period is the facility fiscal year which ended during the calendar year. Therefore the data are reflective of a time span rather than of one point in time, and should be interpreted as such. The

data are presented here as they were reported by the facilities. While the manner and type of information submitted varies with the type of facility, efforts have been made to produce reasonable comparisons. Where the number of facilities has changed since the previous year, a same-facilities comparison is often used.

This report includes data from some 356 facilities providing services to West Virginia residents in FY 2006.



Revenue

The facilities had an aggregated total of patient services revenue, other operating and non-operating revenue of \$5.6 billion, which was an increase of 6.6% over FY 2005.

Hospitals alone accounted for 76.2 % of this revenue; ambulatory surgical centers for less than 0.4%.




EROE

Aggregate profits for all facilities were \$229 million, up 74% over FY 2005. The term profit (loss) is used here interchangeably with excess (deficit) of revenue before taxes and extraordinary items (EROE), and is applied to all facilities, including not-for-profits. Hospitals, hospice agencies and behavioral health centers had increased profits; nursing homes, and ambulatory surgery centers had lower; home health agencies increased their losses.

Together, hospitals and nursing homes comprise 87.9% of the reported revenue and 89.4% of the total profit.




Utilization



Hospital inpatient utilization showed little fluctuation for several years, but there was a decrease of 5,072 (1.7%) in total discharges in FY 2006 from the prior year. The decrease in Medicare discharges of 4,729 (3.2%) accounts for 93.2% of the total decline. Hospital outpatient services continue to grow, although inpatient revenues continue to contribute the larger share of the total. There were more than 5.9 million outpatient visits in FY 2006, an increase of 3.6%. Inpatient utilization of same-facilities nursing homes increased by less than 1% between FY 2005 and 2006. Nursing homes may provide minimal outpatient services, such as physical therapy to discharged patients.

Discharges covered by nongovernment payors (commercial, BlueCross, Carelink, AARP, unions, ERISAs, self-pay) account for 25.9% of total discharges, and 39.2% of revenue. The remaining 74.1% of discharges are covered by government payors, and generate 60.8% of revenue.



Government payors dominate in nursing home services, as well, where Medicare and Medicaid alone cover 87.1% of patient days. Hospitals and nursing homes report payor classes somewhat differently, but general comparisons are still possible. Nursing homes monitor volume based on patient days. Medicaid, with 2.5 million inpatient days (74.6%), is by far the largest payor, with Medicare at 12.5%. Medicare covers only skilled nursing services.

Hospitals

In aggregate, West Virginia's 66 hospitals reported an increase in financial status in FY 2006. Profit (loss) is used here to mean excess (deficit) of revenue over expenses (EROE) prior to taxes and any extraordinary gains or losses. It is used for not-for-profit as well as for-profit hospitals.

The profit for all hospitals was \$172.5 million, or 4.3% of net patient revenue (NPR). This marked a significant increase from FY 2005, when hospitals reported profits of \$72.8 million (1.9% of NPR). Detailed information on aggregate and individual hospital income as well as utilization is shown in Tables 7-19.

West Virginia licenses five types of hospitals: general acute care, critical access (CAH), psychiatric, rehabilitation and long-term acute care (LTCH). Each serves different purposes and different populations. During FY 2006 several for-profit hospitals changed ownership. The four facilities in the state owned by HCA, a national for-profit hospital chain, were sold. Raleigh General, St. Francis and St. Joseph's, Parkersburg, were purchased by LifePoint Hospitals, Inc., a for-profit corporation, on July 1, 2006. Putnam General was sold to CAMC on November 11, 2006. The purchase by CAMC changes its status to not-for-profit. It was also renamed CAMC-Teays Valley Hospital.

Operational changes continued in 2007 with the purchase of St. Francis by Thomas Health System, Inc. and St. Joseph's (P) by Signature Hospitals, LLC. Additionally, St. Luke's Hospital in Bluefield was closed. Each will be discussed more fully in the 2008 Annual Report.

Unless otherwise indicated, this narrative uses the same-facilities data when making comparisons to the prior year. Because of changes from general acute care to CAH and the addition of a new LTCH, some same-facilities comparisons are also used for those categories.

General Acute Care Hospitals

These hospitals provide primarily short-stay medical-surgical services, although they may include units providing a wide range of other services. There were 35 general acute care hospitals in FY 2006. The total acute care hospital profit was \$123.8 million (3.5% of NPR), up from \$62.0 million (1.8% of NPR), in FY 2005. The increased profitability in FY 2006 resulted from a \$25.7 million increase in other revenue, and a decrease in the loss on patient services of \$36.2 million. Uncompensated care increased from 5.9% of gross patient revenue (GPR) in FY 2005 to 6.3% of GPR in FY 2006.

Twenty-two of the 35 acute care hospitals reported a profit. Gains ranged from Grant Memorial's \$652,000 (2.5% of NPR) to CAMC's \$31.4 million (5.5% of NPR). Losses ranged from Williamson's \$142,000 (0.5% of NPR) to Putnam General/Teays Valley's \$7.1 million (22.7% of NPR). The largest percentage loss, 31.3% of NPR (\$5.7 million), occurred at Welch Community.

In FY 2006, three hospitals had margins (profit as a percent of NPR) of 10% or higher. These were, in order, Eye & Ear Clinic (17.7%), Greenbrier Valley (13.6%), Stonewall Jackson (11.3%). Eight hospitals had margins between 5% and 10%. The two largest hospitals, CAMC and WVU, had margins of 5.5% and 5.9% respectively. In FY 2005, only five hospitals had margins greater than 5%, with two

of those having margins greater than 10%.

Overall losses on patient services continued, but improved from the prior year. For FY 2006, aggregate losses of \$57.8 million (1.6% of NPR) were reported compared to \$93.9 million (2.8% of NPR) in FY 2005. Twenty-three hospitals reported losses on patient services ranging from \$296,000 (0.4% of NPR) at Bluefield Regional to \$13.5 million (2.4% of NPR) at CAMC and St. Marys. The largest percentage loss on patient services was 32.7% of NPR (\$10.3 million) at Putnam General. Twelve hospitals reported profits on patient services ranging from \$560,000 (10.2% of NPR) at Eye & Ear Clinic to \$7.8 million (13.3% of NPR) at Greenbrier Valley.

The reduction in losses on patient services was accompanied by an increase in other revenue. Other revenues consist of other non-patient operating revenue and non-operating revenues. Seven hospitals reported an increase in other revenue in excess of \$1 million for FY 2006. WVU had the largest increase of \$11.9 million, followed by CAMC with an \$11.2 million increase. United experienced the largest decrease (\$7.9 million) in other revenue. Only one other hospital (City) had a decrease in other revenue (\$1.4 million) that was greater than one million. Ten hospitals, with losses on patient services, reported profits solely because of other revenues. In FY 2005, there were nine hospitals where this occurred.

Overall, acute care expenses equaled \$3.6 billion in FY 2006; an increase of 4.5% over FY 2005. There was a similar increase of 4.6% in FY 2005. The increase from FY 2003 to FY 2004 was 8.0%. For all hospitals, employee compensation and benefits increased by 4.7% from FY 2005. This is the largest component of total operating ex-

penses (50.4%).

Critical Access Hospitals

Critical Access is a Medicare designation for reimbursing small community hospitals for the provision of limited acute care services in combination with swing-bed and skilled nursing care. In FY 2006, the 19 critical access hospitals experienced mixed results in financial performance. With the conversion of Jefferson Memorial, twelve critical access hospitals reported profits in FY 2006, up from 11 in FY 2005. Total profit for the critical access hospitals was \$3.5 million (1.4% on NPR). Typically, critical access hospitals have small margins; however, Jefferson reported a profit of \$2.8 million, accounting for 79.2% of the total profit. A same facilities comparison, excluding Jefferson, results in an increase in profits of \$2.0 million. The profit for FY 2006 was \$721,000 (0.3% on NPR) up from a loss of \$1.3 million (0.6% on NPR) in the prior year.

Six hospitals reported income from patient services, ranging from Sistersville General's \$42,000 (0.6% of NPR) to Jefferson's \$1.5 million (4.3% of NPR). Losses on patient services ranged from Pocahontas' \$74,000 (1.1% of NPR) to Montgomery's \$1.7 million (9.3% of NPR). Several hospitals have experienced losses for consecutive years. Those losses will be difficult to offset without infusions of non-operating revenues. Guyan Valley closed on December 29, 2006, after six years of consecutive losses.

Increases in net patient revenue of \$6.4 million (3.1%) slightly outpaced increases in operating expenses of \$5 million (2.3%) for FY 2006. Yet, challenges remain for critical access hospitals. These facilities have experienced the same pressures as general acute care facilities to address manpower shortages while maintaining cost controls.

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals (LTCH) are generally defined as hospitals with an average Medicare inpatient length of stay greater than 25 days. These facilities provide extended care including comprehensive rehabilitation, respiratory therapy, head trauma treatment and pain management. Two LTCHs operated in West Virginia in FY 2006. Both facilities are for-profit and privately owned. Select Specialty began providing services during 2001. Originally located within CAMC, Select Specialty moved to St. Francis Hospital during FY 2007. Cornerstone Hospital of Huntington opened in March 2005 and is located within St. Marys Hospital. For FY 2006, Cornerstone reported a profit of \$1.8 million (15.2% on NPR). All but \$5,000 of the profit came from patient services. Select Specialty reported a profit of \$1.5 million (10.2% on NPR), with \$1.4 million earned on patient services. In FY 2005, Select Specialty reported a loss of \$1 million (7.7% of NPR), and a profit of \$768,000 (6.7% of NPR) in FY 2004. A significant component contributing to the swing in Selects profitability was the level of management fees charged by the parent corporation. This expense item was \$1.9 million in FY 2006, compared to \$3.0 million in FY 2005 and approximately \$0.9 million in FY 2004. Additionally, Select reported an 18.3% increase in discharges over the prior year.

Psychiatric Hospitals

Two private and two state hospitals operate as free-standing psychiatric hospitals in West Virginia. While both the private and state hospitals treat psychiatric patients, they operate very differently. For the most part, private hospitals admit voluntary patients, while state-operated hospitals generally do not.

Overall, the four facilities reported a loss of \$702,000, an improvement from the \$5.2 million loss reported in FY 2005. In FY 2004, a gain of \$4.9 million was reported. Mildred Bateman, one of the two state hospitals, reported a loss of \$2.8 million. Sharpe, the other state facility, reported a slight profit of \$286,000. The two state hospitals reported combined deficits of \$50.3 million for patient services. The state hospitals operate at virtually full capacity with extremely high levels of uncompensated care.

Of the two private hospitals, River Park reported a profit of \$1.7 million (9.5% of NPR) and Highland reported a profit of \$116,000. Only River Park, a for-profit facility, has consistently reported profits on patient services for the last six fiscal years. Highlands occupancy rate (38.6%) was the lowest of all four psychiatric hospitals. River Park reported an occupancy rate of 64.2%. Total licensed beds for the four psychiatric facilities equaled 485, almost equally divided between for-profit and state.


Rehabilitation Hospitals

In FY 2006, six rehabilitation hospitals operated in West Virginia. Of the five for-profit facilities, four are owned and operated by Health South, Inc. The remaining for-profit facility, Peterson Rehabilitation and Geriatric Center, is owned and operated by Guardian Eldercare. One hospital, WV Rehabilitation Center, is state owned.

For FY 2006, the for-profit facilities reported an overall profit of \$46.0 million (51.7% of NPR). This is an increase in profit over FY 2005 and FY 2004 of \$24.7 million and \$22.2 million, respectively. Peterson reported other revenue of \$22.5 million. According to the notes of its audited fi-

nancial statement this revenue was due to the gain on the sale of real estate and related assets. Without this significant revenue item the for-profit facilities would have experienced a decrease in profitability of \$1.2 million from what was reported in FY 2005.

The state-owned facility, WV Rehabilitation Center, closed its inpatient services effective June 30, 2006. Over \$65.4 million in losses from patient services occurred over the last ten years. In FY 2006, the facility's loss on patient services was \$9.9 million. Due to other revenues of \$6.4 million, the overall loss was substantially reduced, to \$3.4 million.

Nursing Homes

The FY 2006 Annual Report of Nursing Homes includes information from each of the 106 long-term care facilities operating in the state. Data are provided as reported by each facility. The data are aggregated and compiled as follows: for total facilities and for same facilities. The same facilities comparison is included because prior years data were not submitted for Logan Park Care Center and Mingo Health Care Center. Unless otherwise specified, this narrative uses the total facilities data when making comparisons to the prior year. In 2006, eighty-three for-profit nursing homes operated in the state. Several of the larger corporate entities included: Integrated Commercial Enterprises, Inc. (11), the surviving entity after merging with AMFM Holding Company; Diversicare Management Services (2); Genesis Eldercare (25); HCR Manor Care (7); Mariner Post-Acute (1); and Sun Healthcare Group (7). Three for-profit facilities owned by Beverly Enterprises were sold to Golden Ventures during the year. Heritage, Inc. was sold to Sunwest in June 2006. Two facilities, Logan Park Health Care Center and Mingo Health Care Center, filed bankruptcy in 2004. In November 2006 these facilities were acquired by Trinity Health Care Services, Inc., a for-profit corporation, and began operating as Trinity Health Care Services Logan and Trinity Health Care Services Mingo. Four of the 106 long term care facilities are state operated and include Hopemont, John Manchin Sr. Health Care Center, Lakin and Pinecrest Hospital.

Net patient revenue (NPR) increases fell slightly below operating expense increases in FY 2006 by \$4.3 million. This is a reversal from FY 2005 where increases in net patient revenues were greater than operating expenses by \$23.3

million. Net patient revenue increased by \$27.4 million (4.4%) and expenses increased \$31.7 million (5.4%). The result was a modest decrease in income from patient services of \$4.3 million compared to a \$23.3 gain in FY 2005. Factors contributing to the decrease include an 11.4% increase in Medicare operating expenses and only a 4.4% increase in total net patient revenue. This resulted in profits of \$32.6 million (5.0% of NPR), a decline of \$ 3.4 million from FY 2005. The number of profitable facilities reporting increased from 84 to 85 in FY 2006. Pinecrest Hospital, one of the four state operated facilities, experienced the largest negative EROE, \$4.3 million in FY 2006, compared to a \$1.2 million loss in FY 2005. Arbors at Fairmont experienced the next largest negative EROE, \$1.9 million contrasted with its \$510,000 loss in FY 2005. Two of the remaining three state operated facilities had negative EROE's while Lakin reported a positive EROE of \$136,000. Five facilities with negative EROE's in FY 2005 showed positive EROE's in FY 2006. Seventy-two facilities (67.9%) reported positive EROE's all three years and 16 facilities (15.1%) reported negative EROE's all three years.

Of the 94 facilities that reported Medicare patient services, 87 (92.6%) showed a profit on those services. Of the 104 facilities with Medicaid patients, 61 (58.7%) reported profit on those services. Aggregate income from patient services for Medicare and Medicaid was \$28.6 million and \$910,000, respectively. As a percent of NPR, the margins for Medicare and Medicaid were 20.3% and 0.2%, respectively.

Utilization of 3.3 million total patient days was reported for FY 2006. This is a slight increase over the prior year, but utilization has held constant around the 3.3 million day level since at least 1999. Medicare days increased by 6.5%

while Medicaid days declined merely 0.2%. In FY 2006, Medicare and Medicaid accounted for 12.5% and 74.6%, respectively, of total days. Summers Nursing & Rehabilitation Center experienced the largest decline in total patient days, 35.1%, in FY 2006 due to a 36.0% reduction in Medicaid days.



Home Health

The FY 2006 Survey of Home Health agencies was completed by 72 home health agencies, including those in Kentucky, Maryland and Ohio that serve West Virginia residents. This was the third year that the survey was filed on line. The data are provided as reported by the facilities. Overall, home health agencies reported losses of \$4.3 million, 5.1% of \$84.5 million in total revenue, although 33 of the 72 agencies were profitable. Fiscal year 2006 is the fourth consecutive year for aggregate losses. In FY 2005, losses were \$919,000, 1.1% of total revenue of \$86.9 million. In FY 2004, losses were \$1.5 million, 1.7% of total revenue of \$85.3 million, and in FY 2003, losses were \$547,000, 0.7% of total revenue of \$82.2 million.

Analysis of home health agencies by type of ownership shows mixed results. The agencies are subdivided by the following ownership categories: county-owned, proprietary and non-profit. Hospital-based agencies are discussed separately from other agencies, as the structure is significantly different and they historically experience the greatest losses.

The 11 county-owned agencies reported total losses of \$1.3 million, 31% of \$4.3 million in total revenue. This followed losses of \$226,000, in FY 2005, and \$1.2 million in FY 2004. Two of the 11 county-owned agencies reported profits for FY 2006, a decrease of four agencies from the previous year. Additionally, two county-owned agencies closed during FY 2006.

Total profit reported by the proprietary agencies was \$5.1 million, 12% of total revenue, down 7.8% from \$5.5 million in FY 2005. Of the 24 proprietary agencies, 17 reported profits. This was the only profitable category of

home health agencies. Four non-profit home health agencies were operating in FY 2006. Two non-profit agencies reported combined losses of \$218,000 with total revenue of \$3.5 million. Two non-profit home health agencies were profitable, with a combined EROE of \$46,000, 8.3% of \$552,000 in total revenue. The four non-profit agencies reported a combined loss of \$173,000 on total revenue of \$4.1 million.

The number of non-profit hospital-based agencies losing money outnumbered profitable agencies 19 to 11. Total losses for the year in this segment grew to \$7.6 million from losses of \$5.5 million for FY 2005 and \$4.1 million for FY 2004.

Of the three proprietary hospital-based agencies, two reported aggregate losses of \$409,000, on just over \$1 million of total revenue. The third agency had a profit of \$137,000, up significantly from \$5,000 in FY 2004. The sector reported a combined loss of \$272,000, 21% of total revenue of \$1.3 million. Despite significant losses, hospitals often choose to provide home health care in order to broaden their range of services.

Four home health agencies changed hands during FY 2006. Amedisys West Virginia acquired West Virginia Home Health Services, Gentiva Health Services acquired the two Access Home Health agencies, and Zohar CDO 2003 acquired Intrepid USA Healthcare Services. Additional acquisitions of home health agencies occurred during FY 2007 and will be discussed in the 2008 Annual Report.



Hospice

The Health Care Authority collected data from 19 West Virginia hospice organizations using the Annual Hospice Survey.

In FY 2006, total revenue increased \$16.1 million (28.7%) from FY 2005, while expenses increased \$12.7 million (25.2%). EROE equaled \$9.1 million, an increase in profitability of \$3.4 million (59.3%). Income from patient services was \$3.5 million. Other and non-operating revenues were greater, \$5.7 million compared to \$3.9 million in FY 2005. Non-operating revenues include contributions from fund-raising campaigns and other donations.

Of the 19 agencies reporting, nine reported losses in income from patient services. Of those agencies reporting a loss from patient services, only one had a positive EROE as a result of other and non-operating revenue. Eleven of the agencies were free-standing, eight were hospital-based, and one was based in a home health agency. Only one hospital-based agency reported a profit and only one free-standing agency reported a loss. The home-health based agency reported a profit.

Utilization of hospice services increased in FY 2006. The number of patients served increased slightly (0.7%) and total patient days increased 16.4%.

West Virginia Hospices by County



Behavioral Health

Eighty-one behavioral health facilities filed financial information with the agency for FY 2006, a decrease of one from FY 2005. Of the total behavioral health centers operating in the state in FY 2006, thirteen were regional comprehensive centers that provided a full array of behavioral health services including crisis services; linkages with inpatient and residential treatment facilities; diagnostic and assessment services; provision of support services and treatment services. Other providers specialized in services such as residential treatment; waiver; case management; counseling or combinations of services. Starlight Behavioral Health, Inc. became a new behavioral health service provider in August 2006. DEAF Education and Advocacy Focus of WV was de-licensed as a behavioral health provider on March 3, 2007. Eight methadone treatment centers were operational in West Virginia in FY 2006. The data for these centers are discussed separately.

Aggregate profits of \$8.5 million (1.8% of total revenue), were reported for FY 2006 from the 73 behavioral health facilities. This is an increase of \$1 million over the prior year. Three facilities comprised 87.9% of the profit: Burlington United Methodist Family Services, RSCR-WV, and VOCA Corporation of America. The number of centers reporting profits increased from 43 in FY 2005 to 48 for FY 2006. Twenty-five facilities reported profits for the last three consecutive years including 8 regional comprehensive centers, 16 reported losses during two of the last three years, while only 6 facilities reported losses for all three years.

Methadone Treatment Facilities

In FY 2006 eight methadone treatment facilities operated in the state. While each facility experienced a profit, the aggregate profit declined by \$1.1 million from FY 2005. One contributing factor to this decrease was operating expenses outpaced the growth of total revenue by 13.1%. Two facilities showed gains for FY 2006. Wheeling Treatment Center reversed two years of losses with a profit of \$47,000. Martinsburg Institute's profit grew by \$143,674, a 72% increase. The aggregate profit totaled \$5.7 million, 27.6% of total revenue of \$20.7 million. In FY 2005 the aggregate profit was \$6.8 million, 35.4% of total revenue. The other six facilities also reported profits ranging from \$139,000 at Parkersburg Treatment Center to \$1.7 million at Huntington Treatment Center.



Ambulatory Surgery Centers

Ambulatory surgical centers (ASCs) are distinct entities that provide surgical services to patients not requiring a hospital admission. There are 11 certified ASCs in West Virginia, all of which are for-profit facilities. Total revenue for FY 2006 was \$23.9 million, an increase of \$2.1 million over FY 2005. Expenses equaled \$18.7 million, an increase of nearly \$1 million. The growth in revenue over expenses

resulted in an increase in profit of \$1.1 million over FY 2005. The overall margin (profit as a percent of total revenue) was 21.7%. For FY 2006, eight facilities experienced profits, two had a loss and the remaining center had a zero margin. Tables 27 and 28 show ambulatory surgical center financial and utilization data.



Glossary of Terms

Accounts Payable: Amounts owed to others for goods, services, and supplies purchased and received, but not yet paid for as of the balance sheet date.

Accumulated Depreciation: Amount charged to expense through the annual amortization of the cost of the property, plant, and equipment.

Bad Debt: Amount not recoverable from a patient following exhaustion of all collection efforts.

Capital Lease Obligations: Consists of a portion of the long-term debt obligations incurred for leased items such as equipment and other long-lived assets when leases meet criteria necessary for being capitalized.

Cash: Money in the bank available for immediate expenditure. This may include cash equivalents which are financial instruments that may be readily and quickly converted into cash.

Contractual Allowance: Accounting adjustment to reflect uncollectable differences between established charges for services rendered to insured persons and rates payable for those services under contracts with third-party payers. The amount of the discount from total charges negotiated by the health care provider with an insurer for the provision of health care services. Or, the difference between total charges and the reimbursement allowed by a governmental payer.

Charity Care: Uncompensated care given by a health care facility to indigent and medically-indigent people as part of a written mission or charity care policy. It does not

include accounts written off as “bad debts” or thirty-party adjustments, including those for Medicare and Medicaid. This represents health care services accounted for on the accrual basis which were provided, but were never expected to result in cash inflows.

Current Maturities of Long Term Debt: Amounts payable on bonds, mortgage loans, capital lease obligations, and other long-term debts to be paid in the next 12 months.

Diagnosis-related Groups (DRGs): Classifications in a system to group patients by diagnosis, type of treatment, age, and other relevant factors. Hospitals are paid a set fee for treatment of patients in each DRG category regardless of resource utilization (within limits) under this prospective payment system.

Diagnosis-related Group (DRG) Case Weight: Measure of the relative average expected resource utilization or costliness of patient care in a particular DRG in comparison to the average costliness of all DRGs. A case weight of 1.0000 is given to a DRG with expected resource consumption equal to that of the average of all DRGs.

Excess (Deficit) of Revenue Over Expenses (EROE): Bottom line measure of residual income or (loss) that is generated from the aggregate revenues, expenses, gains, and losses of the facility due to the overall activities of the facility.

Fund Balance and/or Equity: Consists of tax-exempt corporation fund balances and proprietary corporation owner's equity including capital invested and retained earnings.

Gross Patient Revenue (GPR): Amount charged

by the facility for services provided to patients. It is the standard charge made by the facility before discount and contractual allowances.

Income (Loss) from Patient Services: Equals net patient revenue less operating expenses. Net patient revenue only includes payments for patient services rendered, it does not include other operating or non-operating revenues.

Inventory: Cost of supply items on hand that will be used in the next period. It may consist of medical supplies, surgical supplies, pharmaceutical supplies, food, and other supplies.

Long Term Acute Care Hospital (LTCH): Acute care hospital that provides care for patients who have been in an intensive care or short-term care setting and who require an extended length of stay (greater than 25 days). LTCHs are often referred to as a “hospital within a hospital”.

Long-term Debt: Consists of notes payable to banks, revenue bonds payable, and, in some cases, capital lease obligations due to be paid at a date more than one year in the future.

Major Diagnosis Category (MDC): Grouping of DRGs in a higher category of medically related system classifications.

Margin: The percentage of revenue or net income that has been realized after expenses.

Net Patient Receivables: Amounts owed by patients less contractual adjustments and estimated allowances for bad debt.

Net Patient Revenue (NPR): Amount the facility receives or expects to receive from patients and/or third-party payors for the services provided by the facility less contractual adjustments, and allowances for Charity Care and Bad Debt.

Net Property, Plant, and Equipment: Remaining book value of physical assets such as buildings and equipment after subtracting accumulated depreciation.

Non-operating Revenue: Amounts the facility receives from items that are neither directly nor indirectly the result of treating patients or other operating activity. Examples of revenue in this category are investment income and donations.

Other Assets: Items not expected to be expended in the current period. These consist of items such as funds held for bond indenture requirements, investments for self-insured malpractice, and hospitalization programs.

Other Current Assets: Items expected to be expended during the current period. These consist of items such as short-term investments and current portion of assets.

Other Current Liabilities: Accrued expenses for wages and salaries, benefits, and interest.

Other Liabilities: Consists of items such as liabilities for self-insured malpractice, employee benefit programs (pension and health care), and inter-company payables for affiliated facilities.

Other Operating Revenue: Amount the facility receives from sales of items not directly resulting from treat-

ing patients. It includes items such as cafeteria sales and the sale of copies of medical records.

Other Receivables: Receivables from revenue sources other than patients. The receivable may consist of settlement amounts due from Medicare, Medicaid, or from other parties.

Payor: The person, government body, or public or private organization that is responsible for payment of health care expenses. Payors include insurance companies and self-insured employers.

Pre-tax Income: Revenues minus expenses before income tax, and may also exclude extraordinary items.

Prepaid Expenses: Amounts already paid for the cost of items that will be expended in the current period. The prepaid expense may consist of items such as prepaid insurance.

Property, Plant, and Equipment: Historical cost of land, buildings, and equipment owned by the facility. It may also include capital leases, which are leases for the approximate life of the asset.

Swing Bed: Beds certified by Medicare for use in small hospitals as either general medical/surgical or skilled nursing beds with reimbursement based on the specific care provided. Swing beds provide small hospitals with greater flexibility to meet fluctuating demands for inpatient hospital and skilled nursing care.

Total Liabilities: Total of all liabilities listed on the balance sheet.

Total Liabilities and Fund Balances and/or Equity

Equity: Summation of the total liabilities and fund balance or equity shown on the balance sheet.

Total Operating Expenses: Amount recorded by the facility for items purchased or accrued as normal operating expenses. It includes, but is not limited to, items such as salaries, employee benefits, medical supplies, utilities, depreciation, interest on debt, income and provider taxes (if applicable), and all other necessary supplies.

Uncompensated Care: Amount of patient care provided without compensation or reimbursement, consisting of Charity Care and Bad Debt.

- For FY 2006, 356 health service providers provided pertinent data to the Health Care Authority. The categories of facilities reporting include:

*Hospitals • Nursing Homes • Home health agencies • Hospice agencies
Behavioral health facilities • Ambulatory surgery centers*

The compilation and analysis of the data provides a wide variety of reports which assist care providers, government, researchers, and the public make more informed decisions about health services.

WVHCA data supported the work of the WV Perinatal Wellness Partnership the WV Asthma Coalition, diabetes prevention and monitoring programs as well as many others. Through HCAs web site, the public can access over 42,000 documents.

Data collection supports HCAs other mandated duties such as certificate of need and rate review processes.

- In West Virginia, a certificate of need (CON) is required for the addition of a new health service, the purchase of major medical equipment in excess of \$2 million, a capital expenditure in excess of \$2 million, and the addition of new health care facilities.

CON standards have been updated or are currently under review for the following services: hospice, cardiac catheterization, cardiac surgery, computed tomography (CT), ambulatory care and bone marrow transplants.

- The rate review process received 33 requests for inpatient and outpatient charge increases. Requests in the standard and benchmarking categories were approved with appropriate adjustments. During FY 2006, the average inpatient rate increase granted was 2.96 percent.

- The Rural Health Systems Program, co-managed with the Office of Community Health Systems, continues to provide grant or loan funds to rural health care systems that meet Program special project needs guidelines. In 2006, \$820,194.95 in funds were awarded.

Since its inception, the Rural Health Systems Program has awarded over \$6 million dollars to health organizations, such as county health departments, primary care centers, rural hospitals, and special projects community groups.
