

West Virginia College Prepaid Tuition and Savings Program Quarterly Status Report Ending June 30, 2019

Savings Plan Trust Fund

During the quarter, the SMART529 Savings Plan added 1,181 accounts ending the period with 117,702 active nationwide accounts. The assets are valued at \$2,657,916,388.

Of the nationwide accounts, 34,251 are West Virginia resident accounts with a total value of \$574,716,865.

Prepaid Tuition Trust Fund

The West Virginia Prepaid Tuition Plan ended this period with 2,083 active accounts with assets valued at \$35,238,453. During the quarter, there were \$356,818 in qualified tuition benefit distributions and receipts of \$7,878. Prepaid Tuition Trust Fund investments earned \$857,517 during the quarter.

Prepaid Tuition Trust Fund Escrow Account

The Prepaid Tuition Trust Escrow Account was created to guarantee payment of Prepaid Tuition Plan contracts. The Escrow Account will receive transfers of up to one million dollars from the Unclaimed Property Trust Fund each year there is an actuarially determined unfunded liability in the Prepaid Tuition Trust Fund.

Community Outreach

In April, 15 regional winners from the 12th annual When I Grow Up essay contest were selected. A grand prize winner will be chosen at an awards banquet September 12th at the Culture Center in Charleston. Over 3,300 students across West Virginia entered the contest.

The 5th annual SMART5.29K Race was held in May. Funds raised will be used toward college savings accounts for West Virginia children adopted from the foster care system. Our partner, Mission WV, will choose winners from an essay contest. Winners will be announced August 2nd at the Clay Center.

As part of a national marketing campaign with the College Savings Plan Network, SMART529 hosted two Daniel Tiger story time events at the Clay Center in June. Daniel Tiger is the beloved tiger who first appeared on Mister Roger's Neighborhood. This hugely successful event attracted many parents and young children.
